Pet waste contains disease-causing parasites and bacteria, which may end up in our local waters if left on the beach.

Dog poop is high in nitrogen. Excess nitrogen in the water can create water quality conditions that kill eel grass, reduce oxygen, and cause harmful algal blooms. These algal blooms may kill fish, make people sick, and be lethal to pets. This may result in shellfish and/or beach closures.

Picking up dog poop keeps the beach clean and safe for everyone to enjoy.
